



Goal 1: Increase ASCE student membership by 25 %

At present the students of second, third and final year of Bachelors Programme are active members of the Student chapter.

To improve a sense of responsibility among the members, the executive committee has decided to collect a nominal amount of Rs. 50 (INR) from the members as membership fee. This will also contribute towards the establishment charges.

Action Plan: Events are planned to spread the word about the activities of the chapter and to encourage the first year students to join the chapter.

- A presentation on "What is ASCE ?" was presented in classes of students of 2nd year by the Executive committee members
- A one day event was conducted for the 1st year students, during which an orientation class on ASCE
 Student chapter was given and a treasure hunt was conducted after this at the college premises on July 27, 2018
- At the end of the 1st semester an exhibition on sustainable house model was conducted by the students at the civil engineering block, evaluated and prizes were awarded.

Goal 2: Self development of the ASCE members in technical and non technical aspects

Action Plan: The members are encouraged to participate in the technical events being conducted by other professional society bodies of the institution and other institutions. In addition, they have planned many activities for the upcoming academic year.

The theme for the activities for this academic year was chosen as "Smart Thiruvananthapuram (City)"

- Visit to the approach road construction site of MBCET is arranged on a regular basis.

Action Plan: Improve the interactions of the members with other Professional Society bodies and also increase their societal activities

Many members of the team are already associated with many societal activities being organized by the Department and the National Service Society of the College.

Many more students have volunteered to be part of the Societal wing of the student chapter and have started planning the activities for the next academic year.

One such programme was in association with "World Vision", a NGO working towards the upliftment of people in slum areas. It is decided to plan activities at Poonthura, a coastal region which was affected badly by the cyclone, Okhi.














Technical Events..
