

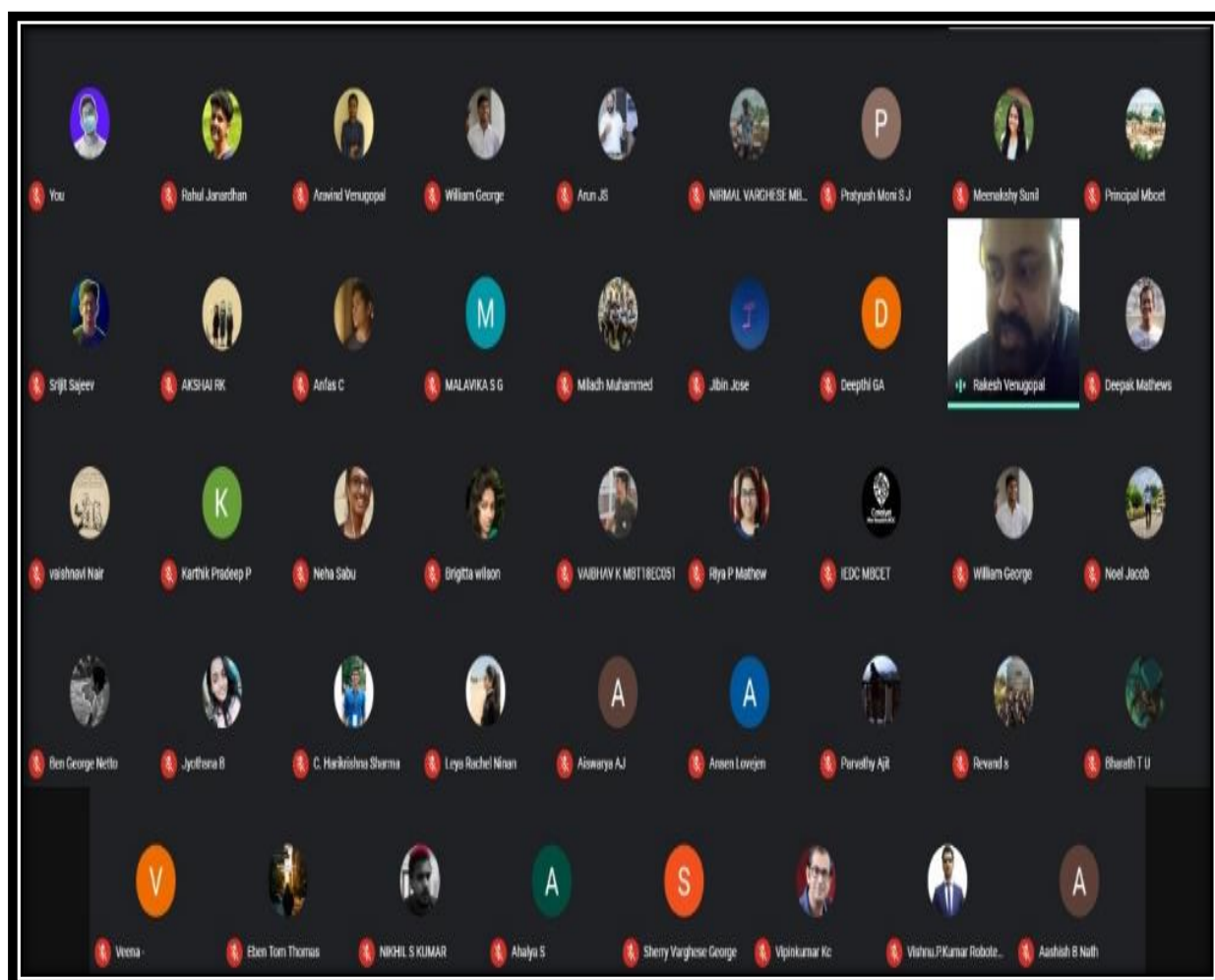

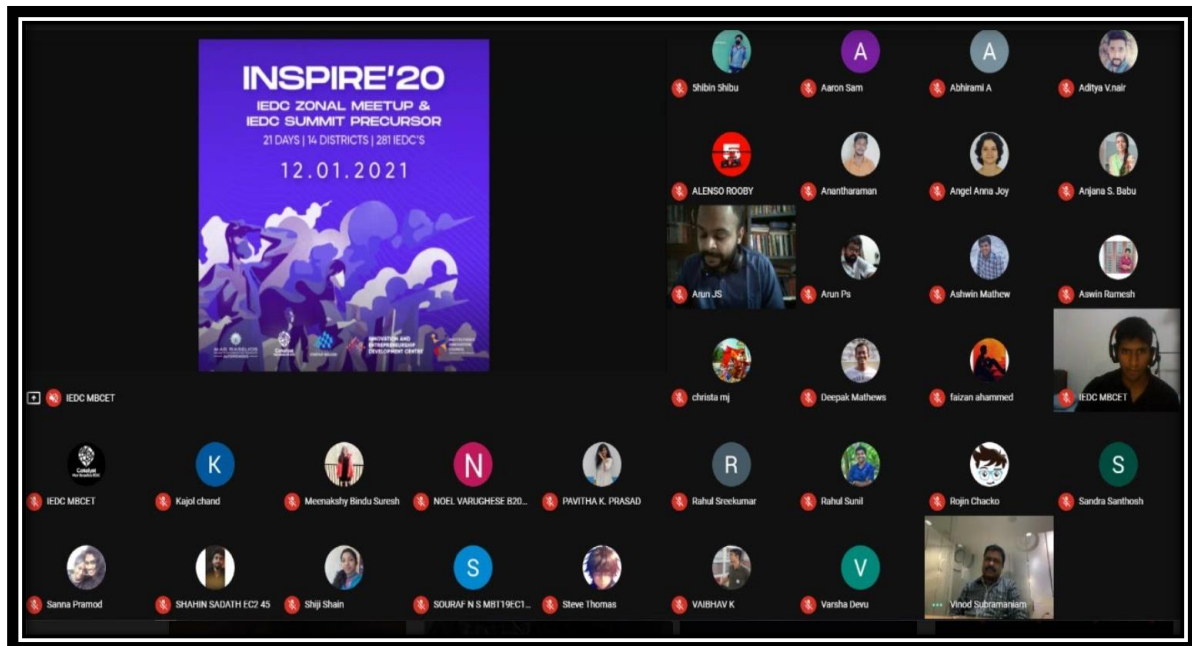
Sochh A thought to share- Ninth Edition – Rakesh Venugopal, ‘How to be comfortable with change’ (19 February 2021)
